HYDATIDS REPORT

(The report in the last issue of the Valley Voice was incomplete & incorrect. It should read as follows:)

There were five new cases of hydatids & ten re-admissions during the twelve months from January to December, 1980.

Two of these patients died during the year & hydatid disease was a major contributing cause of their death.

One of the deaths was a man aged 92 who had never complained of ill health until recently when a complicated hydatid situation was diagnosed. Surgery was not feasible & he died whilst in hospital.

The second death was one of the ten patients who had previously had hydatid operations & who were admitted for further surgery. She was a 75 year old woman who died as a result of massive hydatid disease of the peritoneum. She had been operated on many years ago for the removal of hydatid cysts on the liver.

This means that fourteen Tasmanians had to undergo surgery for the removal of hydatid cysts during the year.

Although the number of cases is an increase on the previous year, (3 new cases & five re-admissions in 1979), it is encouraging to note that there were no new cases in the 0-9 & 10-19 year age groups & only one case in the 20-29 age group.

This is the 6th year in succession that no new case has been reported in the 0-9 age group, & the fourth year in succession that no new case has been reported in the 10-19 age group.

These figures were released recently by the Tasmanian Hydatids Eradication Council which has been conducting a continuing survey into the disease in humans for the Director of Public Health.

The Secretary of the Tasmanian Hydatids Eradication Council, Mr. J.T. Pickmere, said that with the reduction in the numbers of infected dogs from 881 out of 7,000 tested in 1966, to only 18 out of

8,000 tested in 1977, the chances of humans picking up the disease were greatly reduced.

In 1965-66, the percentage of infected dogs found in Tasmania by Department of Agriculture testing teams was 12.66% which explains the high incidence of hydatids in humans in those years. (The percentage of dogs found to be infected in 1979 was only 0.21%)

"Unfortunately, some people are still suffering as a result of those earlier infections by having to have recurrent operations", Mr. Pickmere continued.

"Also new cases may appear for many years to come in people who picked up the infection in the 1960's or before", he added.

"The dramatic drop in the percentage of infected dogs from over 12% to 0.21% over a period of sixteen years is a credit to all those concerned with the control of the disease, a sign of the high success of the eradication programme" Mr. Pickmere added.

The five new cases of hydatids in humans came from Deloraine, Launceston (2), Burnie & Hobart.

(To assist in the control of hydatids, remember DO NOT FEED RAW OFFAL TO YOUR DOG & have them tested.)

CHOCOLATE MINT CAKES

6 ozs margarine
 6 ozs castor sugar
 2 eggs
 4ozs plain flour
 1 oz corn flour
 1 oz cocoa
 2 level teaspoons baking powder.

Filling
 4 ozs butter or margarine
 6 ozs icing sugar
 2 drops green colouring
 a few drops peppermint essence
 icing sugar for dusting

Cream together margarine and sugar until light and creamy. Gradually beat in eggs. Sift together dry ingredients and fold gently into the creamed mixture.
 Divide mixture between cake cases and bake at 375° F, 190° C, Regulo 5, for 20 minutes. Leave to cool.
 Cream toether the butter sieved icing sugar, colouring and peppermint essence.
 Cut the top off the cakes and cut in half. Spoon in cream and replace tops.
