I will give compassion - I will feel for others, not merely going through the motions of doing for them.

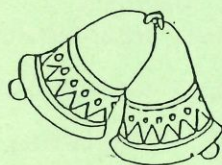

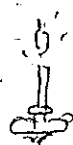

 2/3 cup oil  
 3/4 cup raw sugar  
 1 1/2 cups grated carrot  
 1 cup wholemeal S.R. Flour  
 3 tablespoons sultanas  
 1 teaspoon all spice

Cream oil and sugar.  
 Add eggs one at a time, mixing well after each addition.  
 Add flour, sultanas, spice and finally grated carrot.  
 Pour mixture into a ring tin and

bake for 40 minutes at 180°C (350°F). Apple or pineapple may be substituted for sultanas.

Cut steak into strips, roll meat in salt and 1 tb flour. Brown meat quickly in 2tb butter. Add mushrooms, onion and garlic. Cook till onion is brown and tender then remove from pan. Melt remaining butter, add flour, blend till smooth, cook 1 minute. Add paste and stock then stir till mixture thickens and boils. Return meat to pan, stir in sour cream and heat without boiling. Serve with boiled rice. Serves 4.

## EXTRACTS FROM PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS

14th DECEMBER 1990.

\*We believe that we have had particular success in attending to the needs of students with problems. Students have responded well to patient counselling, individual and small group tuition and the support offered by the local community. We are fortunate that we have had quality staff to achieve the success in spite of the fact that the school has not had the services of a social worker for the whole year or a Guidance Officer since June. We are concerned that the system seems unable to provide replacements for these positions and that, with reduced teaching numbers in 1991, we will be doubly-disadvantaged and find it most difficult to maintain our high standards in this area.

\*We continue to be heartened by the very positive comments made about our students by visitors to the school. Unsolicited comments from visiting performers, Departmental personnel and interviews repeatedly emphasise the pleasant, attentive and open nature of students. Teachers appreciate the relationships they share with their students and serious problems are few.

\*We are pleased that more students recognise the need for study beyond Grade 10 and we feel that our H.S.C. Annex has operated with renewed purpose during this year. Several adults have taken the opportunity to resume or continue their studies and we welcome their involvement.

\*We are concerned that Government cut-backs are felt more severely in the country areas than in the cities. The smaller secondary schools, which are generally in the country areas, are the ones which have been most severely hit by staffing cuts, the A.A.T.S. living away from home allowance for tertiary students has disappeared and school bus fares are expected to be introduced.

\*The aftermath of Cresap has put a lot of pressure on school communities, particularly so close to the end of the year when planning for 1991 is necessary. Reluctantly, teachers are accepting the inevitability of the cuts and are recognising the need to be positive in adjusting school educational programs to ensure optimum conditions for learning.

\*We welcome the devolution of responsibility to schools provided there is a fair distribution of funds which takes into account the wide range of maintenance, energy and equipment needs between schools.

\*At a time when community involvement, enterprise and the importance of a K-12 school philosophy are stressed, the original blanket Cresap recommendation on school farms was a poorly-researched decision and it is only sensible that the Government has seen fit to modify the recommendation. We are confident that our school farm is one of the best-operated and educationally-sound school farms in the state and we believe that existing farm-hand hours must be maintained.

\*We are concerned that the urgently-needed re-development of the school seems as far away as ever.

\*Thank you to all parents, businesses and community organisations who have supported the staff during the year. Care and co-operation are vital for successful educational partnership. We thank all those people who respond positively and show appreciation for the good things we do.

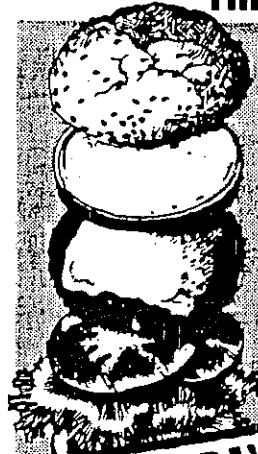

fencing.

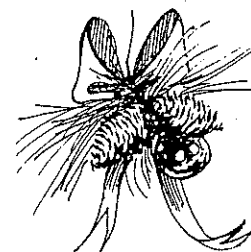
There is also a new fence in front of

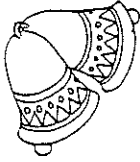

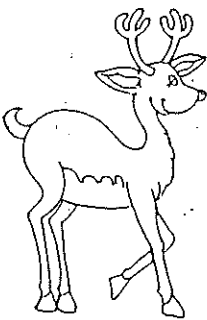
