## Where to from here ?

### THE PLIGHT OF COMMUNITY GROUPS.

The St Marys Association for Community Development Incorporated (SMACD) was formed after a public meeting back in July 1993.

The public meeting attracted some 100 members of the public who were all concerned about the future of St Marys and resulted in a Steering Committee being formed. 16 people came forward to be on that committee.

Over the past three and a half years the group have been involved in many projects which have all benefited the town in some way, those projects include:

- Creating a park on the corner of Main and Cameron St.
- Developing a walk into the Jubilee Mine.
- Producing the "St Marys Streetscape Document" which has resulted in an upgrade of the Cenotaph and Town Hall surrounds and the ongoing development of the river bend where the Musical Playground is situated.
- The now defunct Community Contact Centre was probably one of our more ambitious, rewarding and most disappointing projects.

It was **ambitious** because none of the major players had been involved in such a project previously. It involved a great deal of networking with Government Departments and put us in touch with a very wide section of the community.

It was **rewarding** because it assisted many in numerous ways and most importantly it offered a service which was needed.

The **disappointment** of course was that it could not attract further funding and had to close.

The Community Contact Centre & SMACD brought you Bingo, the monthly Markets, a shop local Campaign and the 1995 Christmas Parade.

We continue to lobby the Break O'Day Council in the hope of having a half pipe and skate board facility erected in the town for our youth and have just ordered a **swing set** to be erected at the Playground site.

The National Estate Grant which we obtained earlier this year is still in progress and will eventually result in documentation of yet unlisted significant sites throughout the Fingal Valley and will include the publication of an Historic Study of the Valley.

This article is not about blowing our own trumpet, it is intended to point out just what a Community Group can achieve if they put their mind to it.

SMACD are not the only group working for the betterment of this Community. There are many other such groups throughout the Municipality including **Landcare, Lion's Club, Chamber of Commerce and the Hospital Support Group. There are sporting groups, playgroups and the likes.**

All are faced with similar problems to SMACD inc. That is keeping up the momentum, trying to attract new members and trying to survive.

At one time or another all of these groups would have asked themselves "is it worth it?"

The local Council have formed a **Streetscape committee**, this group meet on a monthly basis to discuss matters which could and should have a direct impact on the **Main Street** and is there to enable you the community to put ideas forward to Council for the betterment of our town. There are vacancies on this committee but the calling for new members seems to fall on deaf ears. (Contact the Council if your interested)

Several weeks ago a notice was placed in the Valley Voice asking whether there would be a Christmas Parade this year with a contact number should anyone be willing to assist in organising the event. **NOT ONE RESPONSE! Was the 1995 Christmas Parade the last for St Marys??**

November the 23rd is Tasmania Day, there is lots happening in St Marys:

- **LION'S CLUB BILLY CART DERBY.**
- **LANDCARE'S ART & CRAFT EXHIBITION.**
- **SMACD MARKET (in the library grounds)**
- **MUSICAL PLAYGROUND OFFICIAL OPENING**

There is also a **fireworks display** at Scamander for all of the Municipality conducted by the East Coast Arts Council.

In each instance these projects have all been organised by a handful of dedicated workers for the enjoyment of all. One would hope that they will be well attended by the general public. Should you feel that these Community Groups are a benefit, why not consider joining up. I'm sure you would be welcomed with open arms.

Speaking from SMACD's point of view, "if we cannot attract more players, if all of the work is left to only a few, then so be it! **SMACD inc will fold like many groups before us!**"

mine. On the committee were Mr Jack Margison, A. Parsons, E.  
Nicholson, S. Trinder, J. Spratt, M. Targett and the ladies committee  
included Mesdames M. Targett, R. Parsons, A. Parsons, D. Haas, S.  
Thornbury, Harvey, M. Oliver, R. Brough, U. Camplin (was not  
married then). I am the only remaining member. The only donations  
outside the money raised by the committee was 100 pounds from  
the Tasmanian Govt. to seal the front of the hall and \$100.00 from  
Fingal Opportunity shop this year.

The Cornwall Indoor Bowlers installed the toilets and updated the  
kitchen, reglased the windows. The thanks must go to the bowlers  
for their work. The hall committee then had the interior painted and  
installed a stove and a wood heater. The committee which comprises  
of Mr Wayne Squires (treas), Mrs H. Griffiths (Sec), R.Squires,  
D.Squires and U.Camplin, welcome any help that can be given them.  
It is a public hall, built by the public for the public.

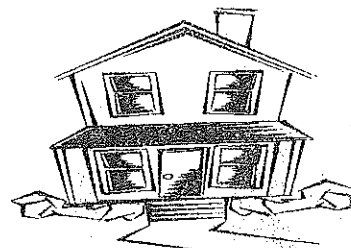

## FARM REPORT

### Calves

The school farm has acquired five new calves and students from grade seven are responsible for accompanying groups of primary students for the twice daily hand feeding at the Calf Paddock Milk Bar. If you're interested feeding times are 9.30 am and 2.30 p.m..

For those of a farming mind the calves are fresian\murray grey and came from Goulds Country, ("and they're soooo cute"! to quote a young feeder.)

### Chooks

Rebecca Lucas and Keitha Davenport (gr.7A) have re-established the poultry side of our operations. They are currently minding some 20 mixed chooks and 4 ducks. They're responsible for feeding and cleaning and have organised an egg market amongst the staff to help with the cost of foods.

Keitha also has some 2 dozen eggs incubating to try to enhance our wyandotte flock. The work done during bees has meant our students can make good use of our farm facilities.

### Lunch-time farm Group

Again thanks to the work done by parents and helpers, a small group of keen volunteers has been able to rotary hoe the garden beds and maintain the garden area, mowing and whipper-snipping. Ivan Grose, Peter Barnes and other helpers intend to plant potatoes with the generous support of Mr. Darryl Richards. So look out for "organically grown spuds" for sale next year.

### Tree Planting

The scheduled planting finally took place, if a little later than intended. Children from all primary grades were involved in the planting of some 600 trees. Their hard work and positive attitude were very impressive. But on a sad note, the ensuing dry, windy weather has severely taxed the young trees and we'll have to replace losses in autumn. Thanks must go to Michael Baxter for all his tractor work "drilling" some 800 holes prior to planting. He drove all the way to Lilydale to obtain an innovative tractor implement.



### Conservation Volunteers

We were indeed fortunate to enjoy the services of a group of young people from around the world (as well as Australia) who spent a week "camping" in the home-arts area while they undertook projects around the school. They worked with the younger students planting trees (it was terrific to eaves-drop on some of the conversations between the preps and Matthew and Andrew from England about footy teams). They also cleared broom from our blackwood plantation; totally cleared the bank next to the gym (which will be planted out after terracing); re-mulched the primary gardens and used Mr Mullan's donated posts to construct a new fence to the bridge across the creek. All for now!!!!

**1. General responsibilities**

Responsible for the daily running of the school canteen and general upkeep of equipment. To provide a safe and hygienic working environment supplying healthy foods to the students of St Marys District High School.

**2. Hours of Duty**

Part-time casual position.

20 hours per week / 5 days per week.

Flexibility is often required for special school events e.g. swimming, athletic carnivals.

**3. Award Wage**

\$10.35/ hour

**4. Special Note**

The successful candidate may be asked not to attend to their duty of work for up to 5 days/year. This will only occur on special occasions e.g. pupil free days, whole school events, possibility of teacher strike.

**5. Primary Tasks**

- To supply lunches to students from all classes (K-10) who order on a particular day.
- To provide a service to students and staff at recess and lunch time in selling food stock available at the canteen.
- To organise parent help in the canteen.
- To order supplies for the canteen
- To manage own wage and maintain the profitability of the canteen.
- To organise insurance, superannuation and long service leave of self.
- To maintain a healthy range of food products available to students.
- To abide by the guidelines as outlined in the School Canteen Handbook.
- To report back to monthly Parents and Friends meetings on the general running, costs and profitability of the school canteen.
- To ensure an annual audit of the school canteen and report findings to Parents and Friends.
- With support of the school principal and staff maintain good student behaviour within the canteen.
- Responsible for advertising prices / specials etc in the school newsletter.
- Weekly banking and reconciliation and keeping of these records.

**6. Selection Criteria**

1. Ability to work closely with the school Parents and Friends Committee.
2. General understanding of canteen and food hygiene.
3. Understanding of ordering, budgeting and maintaining stock and equipment within canteen.
4. High order interpersonal skills when dealing with students, parents and staff.

**LICENCES & NET DEFINITIONS**

A recreational fisher requires a licence to use a mullet net, graball net or a beach seine net in State Fishing Waters. Please be aware of the following regulations which apply to net use.

The following nets may be used:-

(a) one mullet net, having a mesh of not less than 60 mm nor more than 70 mm and having a length not greater than 50 metres is permitted. Areas where mullet nets may not be used are listed in the following pages.

(b) up to two graball nets having a mesh of not less than 100 mm nor more than 140 mm and having a length not greater than 50 metres are permitted. Areas where no nets or only one graball net are permitted are listed in the following pages. Each net has to be licensed separately.

Please note: A gillnet means a single bunt of netting weighted on the leadline (groundline) and buoyed along the corkline (headline), which is intended when set to be on the sea floor and includes mullet and graball nets.

(c) one beach seine net, the mesh of the bag or bunt of which is not less than 30 mm and having a length not greater than 50 metres. There are no netting areas listed in the following pages.

Please note: A person who uses a beach seine net in State Fishing Waters shall:

- (i) bunt up and empty the net in the water; and
- (ii) not draw the net ashore while fish remain in it.

The intention of this regulation is to ensure that the catch is sorted in the water so that unwanted and undersize fish can be released in good condition. No fish should be stranded out of the water during sorting.

A bait net may be used without a licence. A bait net means an encircling net not exceeding 20 metres in length and 2 metres in depth with a mesh of not more than 20 mm.

The mesh size of a net may be calculated by measuring the mesh when it is stretched diagonally and is to be taken to be the average measurement of 10 adjoining meshes when the mesh is held taut with the diagonally opposite knots touching each other.

**BUOY SPECIFICATIONS**

All buoys on nets must be at least 200 mm in diameter. The licence number must be clearly marked on at least one buoy of a graball net or a mullet net.

- A. Inside Shark Nursery Areas - Graball nets must be marked with a red, orange or pink buoy at one end and a white buoy at the other.
- B. Outside Shark Nursery Areas - Graball net must be marked with two buoys, one of which is red, orange or pink and the other of which is white. Mullet nets must be marked with two buoys, one of which is blue or black and the other white. Both buoys may be on a single rope if desired.

**WEIGHT SPECIFICATIONS**

All gillnets must be weighted in one of the following ways in order to prevent drift:

- a) with a metal, concrete or other weight of not less than 2 kilograms tied to the bottom line of the net at each end of the net; or
- b) with a metal, concrete or other weight of not less than 4 kilograms tied to the bottom line at one end of the net; or
- c) the net has a minimum weight, when dry, of not less than 13 kilograms for each 50 metres of its length.

# Cricket News

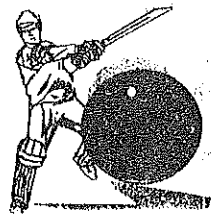

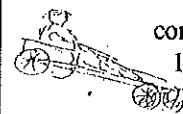

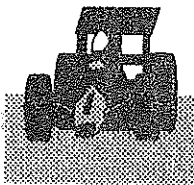
