## How we came to live in St Marys

We visited Tasmania for the first time last October, and on a friends recommendation we made our way to St Marys to stay at Seaview Farm. The only reason we ever noticed Todds Hall at all was because we were both so grumpy when we got to St Marys that we had to pull up outside the newsagent to get a cup of coffee and get into a better mood before going up to Julia's farm.

It was then that Andrew saw the Todds Hall 'For sale' sign and also had a chat with some of the guys who were standing around. They obviously struck a chord with him because that night, while we were chatting with Julia and gazing at the beauty of the area, he could think of little else except Todds Hall sitting there unused while there was so little to do around town for the young people. "Think of all the things we could do Jen!"

I got the bug the next day when we had a look through the place, and started realising that, yes, we could do things here we could only dream about doing in Melbourne, and have the lifestyle to go with it. When we got home, we pulled out all stops to buy Todds Hall.

We have struck quite a number of hurdles since last October, and our move over from Melbourne was a disaster. We loaded up our trusty Kombi Van with all our belongings, including Regie the cat, and broke down before we even got on the boat. We broke down again countless times, and finally came to rest at the roadworks between Avoca and Fingal, ten hours after we had left Devonport.

It was hard not to take it all as a sign that we should not have moved to Tasmania!

Regie was a particularly unhappy cat by this stage, so I hitched a ride into St Marys with him in the boot, while Andrew stayed with the van.

When I arrived, ready to get into our new home, I was told we could not get in until the next day. I'd had just about enough by this stage, but was about to find out that we had come to a good place. Deidre from the newsagent let me put Regie in their shed so I at least had my hands free, then Ross and Sue from the garage towed the Kombi into St Marys, put us up for the night, and made us feel like friends instead of the strangers we were.

Since then everyone we've met has been friendly, welcoming and encouraging. Melbourne is but a distant memory.

So now we're here with enough hard work in front of us to last a lifetime, but ready to make Todds Hall come alive again. St Marys is now our home, and we love it here.

## Health Hazards to watch out for.

Health hazards abound in this world.

The usual ones with which we are familiar: smoking, driving too fast, eating too much fat, have been done to death, if you'll excuse the pun — everyone jumps on the bandwagon about them.

But what about poverty ? Now there's a health hazard if ever I heard one.

Absolute poverty of course, means absolute death, but relative poverty is not all that pleasant either.

Limited resources means scrimping and saving, cutting back or even cutting out altogether, the little luxuries that make life healthier and happier.

We all know that the only real cure for poverty is prosperity.

But who knows what could result from the tossing around of ideas, and throwing up of creative suggestions.

Properly marketed, we are all told that anything can sell. So let your imaginations run riot!

It is not beyond the bounds of possibility or probability that your group may be the first to successfully and prosperously market and sell the challenges and delights of poverty.

Herman used to go over every Sunday for dinner and tea, he asked Myness how did they like living there. Myness said "Oh it's alright only it a Old Gray Hole". Those days the sea fogs came from over the Elephant from the coast and fogs came from up the marsh some times they would last nearly all day. So they dropped Old Gray Hole and just called it Gray.

Herman Langers story to us.

Millers Hill, from the gravel pit down is named after a cruel boss named Miller, boss of convict labor on St Marys Pass. He was very cruel, hit the men for nearly nothing. They got sick of his cruel ways and they talked it over and decided to kill him. One day he hit a man, then the rest bashed him to death and he is buried under the road, that's how it got the name of Millers Hill.

This was handed down from people of the old generation, what a pity our history has to die.

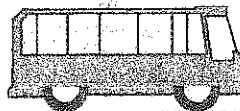

The Break O' Day Business Enterprise Centre (BEC) is aiming to create 45 jobs for the East Coast during the next 12 months. The centre has again received State Government funding of \$20,000 under the Local Government Initiatives (LEI) program, which will enable it to employ a full-time facilitator to focus on reaching the jobs target.

Labor Member for Lyons, Michael Polley will tonight hand over a cheque to the chairman of the Centre's Board, Andrew MacGregor, which will enable the current Business Facilitator at the Centre, Neil Butterworth to continue in his role.

Mr. Polley said the Centre's proposal for funding included a strategic plan to create 45 new jobs and assist in the creation of 10 new businesses on the East Coast.

"I think what the Break O' Day Business Enterprise Centre is embarking on is very exciting."

"The Centre expects its upcoming second year in operation will produce job results."

"The first year in operation was when the ground work was being laid"

"The Centre undertook an audit of 500 local businesses, which has now provided Mr. Butterworth with a valuable tool - a database of what businesses in the local area will require in terms of employment for the next 12 months."

The audit asked businesses to identify if their business would expand and if they expected to expand their work force.

The resulting information has now meant that Mr. Butterworth can focus directly on where jobs are expected to be created and subsequently ensure that people have the skills for those jobs.

Mr. Polley said the audit of local businesses also identified the main areas of jobs growth for the East Coast.

These include:

- Hospitality and tourism
- Agriculture and aquaculture
- Retail

Mr. Polley said identifying these key areas has put the Break O' Day BEC already in front in the quest for jobs.

Mr. Butterworth can now ensure that unemployed people are made aware of the expected opportunities that will exist on the East Coast. I commend the BEC on the initiative

It is a good example of how Local Employment Initiatives (LEI's) work.

They are an excellent, cost effective program which allow communities to tap into local resources, ideas and talents to promote economic and jobs growth.

This year the Government is providing \$600,000 to 17 projects around the state under the LEI program.

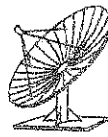
