Dog attacks and the laws

I recently commented in the Valley Voice on the issue of dog attacks and dogs wandering in public places and on private land. As a result of this article I have received a number of enquiries in respect to dogs attacking livestock and when their destruction is authorised by law.

Whilst it would always be my preference that issues with dogs be resolved through consultation with the Dog Control Officer at the Break O'Day Council or through Local Police, there may be times when the destruction of a dog is necessary by a member of the public at the time of the attack. I think it appropriate that I comment on the relevant sections of the Dog Control Act and also the Firearms Act.

The Dog Control Act states that a person may destroy a dog if the person:

- ◆ is being attacked by a dog
- ◆ sees the dog attacking another person or animal

A person carrying on primary production relating to livestock on rural land may destroy a dog found at large on that land. That person is then obliged to notify the Council General Manager of the destruction within 14 days. The person destroying the dog must do so quickly and without causing undue suffering. A person is immune from any action or claim resulting from the destruction provided it is done without the animal suffering unduly.

Relevant sections of the Firearms Act that must still be complied with are as follows:

- ◆ a person must not discharge a firearm from, into or over public place unless the person is the holder of a licence and is undertaking the purpose to which the licence relates
- ◆ a person must not discharge a firearm recklessly or without due regard to the safety of another person or property
- ◆ a person must not discharge a firearm within 250 metres of a dwelling house except with the consent of the occupant of that house.

A poignant exhibition

Christina Henri's moving Bicentenary display, 'Departures and Arrivals' of very simple calico colonial christening bonnets placed on stocking covered polystyrene balls stood in the form of a cross, reflected the harsh conditions that convict women were exposed to in Van Diemens Land.

On Friday 30th July, our Break O'Day Deputy Mayor, Councillor Margaret Osborne officially opened the display at the e.Scape Café Gallery in St Marys with almost ninety people attending the poignant afternoon. 'Arrivals and Departures' was the official government term used for recording births of babies born at the Female Factory. The official record was anonymous, no identity of mother nor baby. Records show that in 1883, 208 babies and infants died at the Female Factory and between 1829 and 1877 out of 1200 births 900 died in Hobart alone.

"By using the repetitive image of 900 bonnets in 'Departures and Arrivals' I am trying to commemorate the deceased infants. The large scale of the work relates to the enormity of the loss experienced," Christina said.

The amazing part of the story is that this year women everywhere were moved to produce not 900 bonnets but 1900 + 3 bonnets! It is a lovely display and a means by which we can recognise and commemorate the lives of these colonial women.

An added enjoyment for the afternoon was several items presented by the Grassy Bottom Singers. Their beautiful a cappella singing has become very professional and the singers are to be congratulated for their achievements.

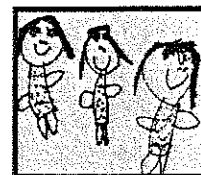

I wonder would Break O'Day Council revisit this idea to help a genuine need in identifying what resources are required and budgeted for so that a wider proportion of our community can benefit in regard to recreation.
