GETTING TO KNOW THE STAFF

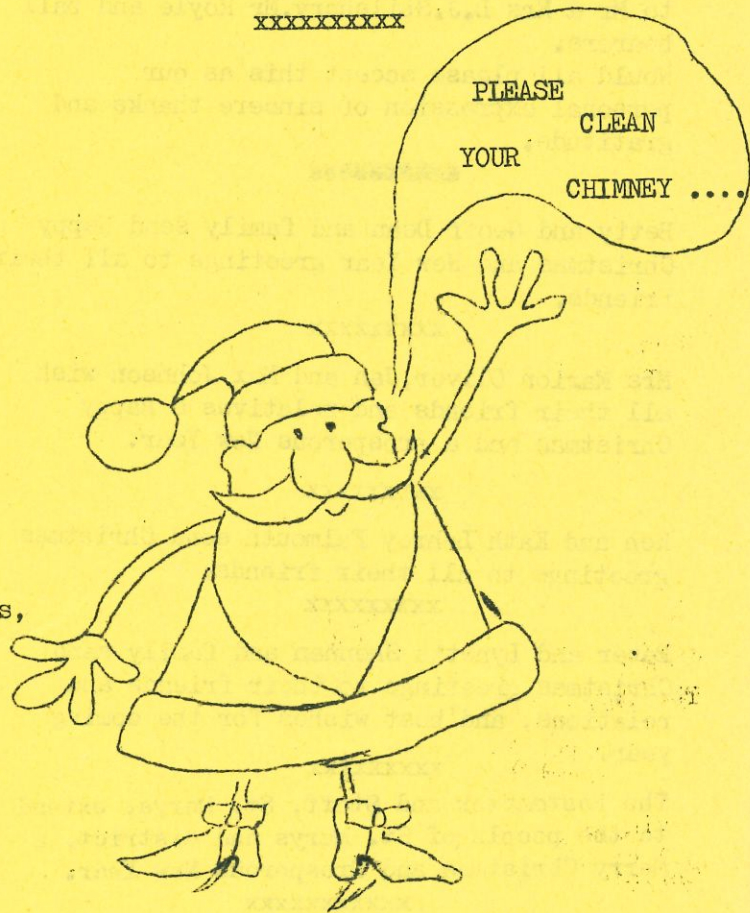
There are folk "thankyou" who drop into help now and then,to type staple and sort papers in our little den,

St. Helens Surf Angling Club were scheduled to hold a surf contest at the Gardens last Sunday. As usual, it rained, and hard enough to wash away the score sheet apparently as I have not been able to get the results. Scamander Angling club will conduct a combined surf and bream contest at Scamander River on Sunday 28th December from 12 noon to 6 p.m. St. Helens Game fishing club have listed their first rally day for 18th January 1976 provided there are reports that the Tuna have arrived in this area. So far, no reliable reports of sightings have been received but Tom Tucker says that water temperature had reached 64 degrees F. on a trip last week. Here is a method of calculating the approximate time for high water as laid down by Tom. When it is full moon or new moon, high water on St Helens bar will be 9 o'clock (standard time) or 10 o'clock (summer time) on that day. You can read the moon dates from the daily paper or from a good calendar and add or subtract 50 minutes per day to arrive at high water for any day before or after the moon. This method is sufficiently accurate to be a useful guide to your favourite fishing tide. As an example, it will be full moon today (Friday 19th Dec), so high water will be around 10 o'clock. The following Friday, it will occur at 4 o'clock. I wish everyone a happy Christmas and tight lines for 1976.

GARDENING NOTES
